Prompt One

Prompt Two

Prompt Three

How has your childhood shaped who you are today? How do you include "little you" into your objectives and dreams? Do you believe you're making that individual proud? (Minimum 500 words)

Prompt Four

What are the issues you are currently trying to solve? How does this drive impact you on your college campus? Do you see yourself making this impact after you graduate? (Minimum 500 words)
